 - Collecting and scoring data of the athletic performance of athletes receiving consultation services from ABASI.
 - Assisting with teaching workshops in the community
 - Assisting with development of workshop material and intervention plans
 - Maintaining a positive relationship between ABASI community partners and athletes receiving services
